PRE-REGISTRATION

Pre-Registration determines what course will be offered during the 2018-2019 school year. The courses students select during the pre-registration process will be those they will be required to attend next school year. Generally, all courses listed will be offered provided there are 25 or more students who register for said courses. Counselors will meet with all current 6th and 7th grade students to assist them with the pre-registration process. Pre-Registration will take place January 22 through February 2, 2018. Parents can log into Infinite Campus to view student course selections after March 12, 2018.

What is plagiarism?

Plagiarism is a common form of cheating or academic dishonesty in the school setting. It is representing another person's works or ideas as your own without giving credit to the proper source and submitting it for any purpose. Examples of plagiarism can include, but are not limited to:

Academic Courses

English 6—This one-year course provides instruction in the English Language Arts strands identified by the Nevada Academic Content Standards as reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. Pre-Requisites: ELA 5

Accelerated English 6—This one-year course provides instruction in the English Language Arts strands identified by the Nevada Academic Content Standards as reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. This course is designated as accelerated by the faster instructional pacing and depth of content. This course is designed to build knowledge and critical thinking skills through close reading of texts; writing to support claims, to clarify ideas, and/or to develop ideas; and a range of collaborative discussions. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the sixth grade English requirement.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in in Previous ELA Course(s) and Teacher Recommendation

Reading 6—This one-year course emphasizes the development of critical reading skills. A variety of literature and informational text of steadily increasing sophistication is used. Through close reading, critical writing, class discussions, and presentations, students deepen their ability to analyze, evaluate, and critique text independently. Students actively seek to understand other perspectives and cultures through reading and listening. Technology is used thoughtfully to enhance and integrate reading, writing, speaking, listening, and language use. This course fulfills the sixth-grade reading requirement.

Pre-Requisites: ELA 5

Accelerated Reading 6—This one-year course emphasizes the development of critical reading skills. This course is designated as accelerated by the enhanced instructional pacing, depth and breadth of content, and is designed for students who have demonstrated advanced reading skills. Students enrolled in this accelerated course read, comprehend, and interpret a variety of grade level and above grade level text independently and proficiently. Through close reading, critical writing, class discussions, and presentations, students deepen their ability to analyze, evaluate, and critique text. Students actively seek to understand other perspectives and cultures through reading and listening. Technology is used thoughtfully to enhance and integrate their reading, writing, speaking, listening, and language use. This course fulfills the sixth-grade reading requirement.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in in Previous ELA Course(s) and Teacher Recommendation

Math 6—This one-year course is designed to focus on four critical areas:
1) connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplication and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems; 2) completing understanding of division of fractions and extending the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers; 3) writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations; and 4) developing understanding of statistical thinking. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the mathematics requirement for sixth-grade students.

Pre-Requisites: Math 5

Accelerated Math 6—This one-year course is designed to prepare students for the increased rigor of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) Algebra I in middle school. This compacted course includes the grade six curriculum as well as a portion of the currently adopted CCSS grade seven curriculum. This course focuses on six critical areas: 1) connecting ratio and rate to whole number multiplication and division and using concepts of ratio and rate to solve problems; 2) completing understanding of division of fractions and extending the notion of number to the system of rational numbers, which includes negative numbers; 3) writing, interpreting, and using expressions and equations; 4) developing understanding of statistical thinking; 5) developing understanding of and applying proportional relationships; and 6) developing understanding of operations with rational numbers and working with expressions and linear equations. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the mathematics requirement for sixth-grade students

Pre-Requisites: A/B in in Previous Math Course(s) and Teacher Recommendation

Science 6—This one-year course is designed to integrate science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas from the life sciences, Earth and space sciences, and the physical sciences. The topics covered in Science 6 include Energy; Structure and Properties of Matter; Earth's Systems; Weather and Climate; Human Impact; Structure, Function, and Information Processing; Growth, Development, and Reproduction of Organisms; and Engineering Design. Demonstrations and lab experiences that employ proper safety techniques are essential to this course. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the sixth-grade science requirement.

Pre-Requisites: Science 5

Accelerated Science 6—This one-year course is designed to integrate science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas from the life sciences, Earth and space sciences, and the physical sciences. This course is designated as accelerated by the enhanced instructional pacing and depth of content. The topics covered in Science 6 Accelerated include Energy; Structure and Properties of Matter; Earth's Systems; Weather and Climate; Human Impact; Structure, Function, and Information Processing; Growth, Development, and Reproduction of Organisms; and Engineering Design. Demonstrations and lab experiences that employ proper safety techniques are essential to this course. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the sixth-grade science requirement.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Previous Science Course and Teacher Recommendation

Physical Education 6—This one-semester course provides students the opportunity to develop a health-enhancing level of physical fitness. Students engage in movement and fitness activities at moderate to vigorous levels for a minimum of 50% of the instructional time. Through participation in physical activities, students develop motor skills, movement patterns, and safety within the course. Health-enhancing fitness concepts are explored through personal goal setting and self-evaluation. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the physical education requirement for sixth-grade students.

Requirement: KO Knudson PE Uniform (Shirt: \$10.00; Shorts: \$10.00)

Computer Literacy—This one-semester course provides students with fundamental computing skills. Areas of emphasis include Internet use and safety, office productivity applications, and system fundamentals. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight. This course fulfills the one-half computer credit required for high school graduation.

Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program

The State of Nevada's Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship Program provides financial support to Nevada's high school graduates who attend an eligible Nevada community college, state college, or university. You may receive up to a maximum award of \$10,000 for undergraduate coursework during the six years following your high school graduation. There is no application form to complete. If you meet all Millennium Scholarship requirements upon high school graduation, the District will submit your name to the Office of the State Treasurer. You will receive an award notification in early August. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the mathematics requirement for seventh-grade students.

Pre-Requisites: Math 6



Accelerated Math 7—This one-year course is designed to prepare students for the increased rigor of the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) Algebra I in middle school. This compacted course includes grade seven curriculum as well as a portion of the currently adopted CCSS grade eight curriculum. This course focuses on six critical areas: 1) developing understanding of and applying proportional relationships; 2) developing understanding of operations with rational numbers and working with expressions and linear equations; 3) solving problems involving scale drawings and informal geometric constructions, and working with two- and three-dimensional shapes to solve problems involving area, surface area, and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with a linear equation, and solving linear equations and systems of linear equations; and 6) analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence, and understanding and applying the Pythagorean Theorem. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the mathematics requirement for seventh-grade students.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Previous Math Course and Teacher Recommendation

Science 7—This one-year course is designed to integrate science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas from the life sciences, Earth and space sciences, and the physical sciences. US Nevada History 7—This one-year course is a study of Nevada from statehood to present day and American history from the time of the American Revolution through World War II. Students explore and evaluate challenges facing the new nation and make connections between the rise of industrialization and contemporary social and economic conditions. The history of Nevada is integrated throughout the year. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to our society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is a required course for all seventh grade students.

Pre-Requisites: ELA 6

Accelerated US Nevada History 7—This one-year course is a study of Nevada from statehood to present day and American history from the time of the American Revolution through World War II. Students explore and evaluate challenges facing the new nation and make connections between the rise of industrialization and contemporary social and economic conditions. The history of Nevada is integrated throughout the year. This course is distinguished from U.S./ Nevada History 7 by instructional pacing and delivery of advanced content. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to our society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is a required course for all seventh grade students.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in 6th Grade ELA and Teacher Recommendation

This course is designed to build on knowledge and skills through close reading of texts, learning combining elements of different kinds of writing in support of analysis and reflection, and class discussions. Accelerated English 8—This one-year course provides instruction in the English Language Arts strands identified by the Common Core State Standards as reading, writing, speaking and listening, and language. This course is designated as accelerated by the enhanced instructional pacing and depth of content. This course is designed to build on knowledge and skills through close reading of texts, learning combining elements of different kinds of writing in support of analysis and reflection, and class discussions. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the eighth grade English requirement.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Previous ELA Course and Teacher Recommendation

Pre-Algebra—This one-year course is designed to focus on three critical areas: (1) formulating and reasoning about expressions and equations, including modeling an association in bivariate data with a linear equation, and solving linear equations and systems of linear equations; (2) grasping the concept of a function and using functions to describe quantitative relationships; (3) analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence, and understanding and applying the Pythagorean Theorem. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness, including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to our society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the mathematics requirement for eighth-grade students.

Pre-Requisites: Math 7

Algebra I—This one-year course provides students with the necessary knowledge and skills for further studies in mathematics. It is intended to increase mathematical fluency in problem solving, reasoning, modeling, and effective communication in the study of numbers, algebra, functions, and statistics. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the Algebra I requirement and one of the mathematics credits required for high school graduation.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Previous Math 7 Accelerated and Teacher Recommendation

Geometry Honors (*Virtual Online Class*)—This one-year course provides students with a rigorous study of Euclidean geometry including advanced topics. It incorporates problem solving, reasoning, modeling, and effective communication in the study of transformational geometry, trigonometry, measurement, and probability. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills one of the mathematics credits required for high school graduation. Online course. *Pre-Requisites:* Algebra I and Teacher Recommendation

Clark County SCHOOL District POLICY and Regulation 5123 Promotion, Retention, AND Demotion of Students

- A pupil in Grade 6 must complete one semester with a passing grade in mathematics, English or reading, and science for promotion to seventh grade.
- A pupil in Grade 7 must complete one semester with a passing grade in mathematics, English or reading, science, and social studies for promotion to eighth grade.
- A pupil who enters Grade 8 must complete three semesters with a passing grade in mathematics, three semesters with a passing grade in English or reading, two semesters with a passing grade in science, and two semesters with a passing grade in social studies during the seventh and eighth grade years for promotion to high school. An eighth grade student who does not meet promotion requirements may be promoted to high school on academic probation provided the student meets the criteria for academic probation. A parent or guardian may elect not to place his/her child on academic probation but to remain in Grade 8.

Please realize that your child will be retained automatically. State law and District policy require K.O. Knudson Middle School to retain you child if he/she does not meet the requirements.

Science 8—This one-year course is designed to integrate science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas from life sciences, Earth and space sciences, and the physical sciences. The topics covered in Science 8 Accelerated include Forces and Interactions; Energy; Waves and Electromagnetic Radiation; Space System; Growth, Development, and Reproduction of Organisms; Natural Selection and Adaptations; and Engineering Design. Demonstrations and lab experiences that employ proper safety techniques are essential to this course. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the eighth-grade science requirement.

Pre-Requisites: Science 7

Accelerated Science 8—This one-year course is designed to integrate science and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas from life sciences, Earth and space sciences, and the physical sciences. This course is designated as accelerated by the enhanced instructional pacing and depth of content. Students synthesize concepts, patterns, and interdependent relationships that make our ever-changing world diverse and dynamic. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is a required course for all eighth grade students.

Pre-Requisites: US Nevada History 7

Accelerated World Geography 8—This one-year course is the study of the world's cultures, economics, history, regions, and geographic features from the development of ancient civilizations through the Age of Exploration. Students examine the earth from the scale of states, nations, countries, and continents creating connections to contemporary geographic conditions. Students synthesize concepts, patterns, and interdependent relationships that make our ever-changing world diverse and dynamic. Accelerated World Geography is distinguished from World Geography 8 by instructional pacing and delivery of advanced content. Physical Education 8—This one-semester course provides students the opportunity to develop a health-enhancing level of physical fitness. Students engage in movement and fitness activities at moderate to vigorous levels for a minimum of 50% of the instructional time. Through participation in physical activities, students develop motor skills, movement patterns, and safety within the course. Health-enhancing fitness concepts are explored through personal goal setting and self-evaluation. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the physical education requirement for eighthgrade students.

Requirement: KO Knudson PE Uniform (Shirt: \$10.00; Shorts: \$10.00)

Computer Literacy—This one-semester course provides students an introduction to the mental, physical, social, emotional, and environmental aspects of human wellness. Goal setting and decision making processes are the foundation of this course. Topics include wellness, nutrition and physical activity, body systems, substance use and abuse, communicable and non-communicable diseases, violence prevention, safety, and consumer health. Sex education and sexually transmitted infectious disease education, within established guidelines, is an integral part of this course. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to our society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This course fulfills the health requirement for eighth-grade students.

The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Intermediate Dance—This one-year course provides an intermediate focus for second year dance students. Introduction to Drama/Technical Theatre—*Drama:* This aspect of the course will introduce middle school students to the theatre by providing a basic study in the fundamentals of oral and dramatic communication, as well as theatre content to include: intent, structure, effectiveness, and value. Class work will focus on student performance and participation through demonstration of various acting skills with an emphasis on types and techniques that utilize the vocal, physical, and emotional aspects of acting. Group dynamics, body movement, pantomime, vocal techniques, monologues, theatre history, scenes, and performance skills will be covered. Technical Theatre: This aspect of the course is designed for the student who is interested in pursuing the design aspects of theatre, including lighting, sound, set design, costuming, and make-up. Students will also study the evolution and story of costuming and make up techniques in the theatre. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight.

Pre-Requisites: None

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Intermediate Acting—This one-year course is designed for middle school students who have successfully completed the Introductory Drama 6 class or experienced in-depth school-related performance or community theatre exposure. Students will improve and demonstrate acting skills through reading, writing, interpreting, rehearsing, and performing. Development and refinement of acting skills will be enhanced through continued work in body movement, vocal techniques, characters, script production and analysis, monologue, and script performance. Group interaction will be emphasized to provide cooperation and appreciation for individual differences. Continuous emphasis will be placed on awareness and creative self-expression in order to increase knowledge of the theatre arts concept and encourage social adjustment. Participation in theatre production will be required. The prerequisite for this course is Introduction to Drama. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Theatre Performance—This one-year course is designed to provide a more advanced knowledge of theatre through performance. Instruction focuses primarily on the students' improvement and demonstration of acting skills. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. This course will run in two semester units, the first dealing with set design, lighting and sound. The second will deal with make-up and costuming. Hands on experience in actual construction will occur, as needed, with any current productions being staged. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: Introduction to Drama with Teacher Recommendation

Advanced Technical Theatre—This production- based, one-year course is designed to provide students with information and experience in the technical aspects of theatre production. The student will participate in technical projects in the following areas: set design, set construction, lighting design, lighting application, sound and special effects, makeup design, make-up application, and costume design. Students will be responsible for designing, constructing, and running all aspects of the current school drama production. Students will also be required to work on running crews for all school productions, assemblies, concerts, and other events. After school and/or nighttime participation and time commitments are required. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Intermediate Technical Theatre; C in Intermediate Technical Theatre with Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Technical Theatre: Design & Craft—This one-year course is designed to familiarize students with many aspects of theatre design history, construction, and drawing. Class work focuses on developing hands-on construction of costumes, props, and other theatre design elements. Digital Media & Visual Arts Courses

Visual Arts

Art History (Beginning Art)—This is a one-year, discipline-based course designed for first year middle school magnet students, who have chosen the visual arts strand focus. This introductory course will provide students the opportunity to explore a wide variety of experiences relating to art appreciation, the elements and principles of design, utilization of different art media, and production of artwork. Art experiences will stress exploratory and experimental approaches to understanding, creating, and responding to artwork. This course offers a good foundation for acquiring essential skills that can be extended to help develop techniques and skills which make creative expression in two- or three-dimensional media possible. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: None

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Composition & Design (Intermediate Art)—This is a one-year, discipline-based course designed for second year middle school magnet students who have chosen the visual arts strand focus. This intermediate course will expand and refine the skills acquired in the first year introductory art class relating to art appreciation, the elements and principles of design, utilization of different art media, and production of artwork. Students will be encouraged and expected to develop avenues to express their artistic ideas through in-depth study that stresses understanding, creating, and responding to art experiences. Students will begin to focus on a personal preference for art expression through specifically chosen mediums. This course offers a solid foundation for transition into the third year course work, as well as, providing students the opportunity to refine previously learned skills and apply them to a more specific area of study. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: C or better in Art History and/or Teacher Recommendation Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Studio Production (Advanced Art)—This is a one-year, discipline-based middle school course designed for second and third year middle school magnet students who have chosen the visual arts strand focus. This advanced course will further expand and refine the skills acquired in the first and/or second year art classes relating to art appreciation and criticism, the elements and principles of design, mastery of various art media, and production of art work. Students will be expected to develop avenues to express their artistic ideas through in-depth study that stresses understanding, creating, and responding to art experiences, as well as the development of personal style. Students will focus on a personal preference for art expression through specifically chosen mediums. This course offers a solid foundation for transition into high school course work, as well as providing students the opportunity to refine previously learned skills and apply them to a more specific area of study. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: C or better in Composition & Design and/or Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Computer Graphic Design

Computer Design I—This one-year course is designed for students who are concurrently enrolled in Computer Literacy. Areas of emphasis include graphic design layout, typography, elements of art and image manipulation. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: None

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$20.00 to cover supplies

Computer Design II—This one-year course is designed for students who have successfully completed Computer Design I or its equivalent. Areas of emphasis include principles of technical design and industry-standard format and design. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: C or better in Computer Design I with Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$20.00 to cover supplies

Computer Design III—This one-year course is designed for students who have successfully completed Computer Design II or its equivalent. Students use advanced multimedia skills to create a variety of projects. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: C or better in Computer Design II with Teacher Recommendation *Requirements*: Dues/Fees: \$20.00 to cover supplies

Television Production

Television Production—This one-year course is designed to provide students with a general understanding and attainment of basic skills in the technical, directorial, written, and historical aspects of television production. The operation of television cameras, lighting, audio, video, and computer graphics equipment is stressed, as well as set design, script development, and the history of the television medium. Students will experience hands-on production tasks in a rotational system to become familiar with techniques used in the broadcast industry. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: None

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Photojournalism—This one-year course is designed to be the second in a sequence for TV Production. Students will be introduced to concepts, processes and techniques, which include editing, the code of ethics, field camera situations, news writing, and video package production. Students will experience hands-on production tasks that are utilized in the TV industry. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Television Production; C in Television Production with Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Newscasting—This one-year course is designed to be the third in a sequence for TV Production. Students will be provided with an in-depth study of current TV technology to include: production and writing styles, production formats, editing processes, directing approaches, and utilization of a state-of-the-art television studio. Students will demonstrate, through independent production, their knowledge of newscasting techniques and styles. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Newscasting; C in Newscasting with Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Independent Study—This one-year course is designed to enhance and expand on knowledge and skills learned in other Television Production courses. The course is designed for select and self-motivated students to assist with the production of various on campus media. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. This is an elective course appropriate for grades six through eight and may be repeated.

Pre-Requisites: Teacher Recommendation

Requirements: Concurrent Enrollment in Other Television Production Course: Dues/Fees: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Robotics—This one year course is designed to integrate scientific and engineering practices, crosscutting concepts, and core ideas related to robotics. This course introduces students to a broad range of robotics principles, vocabulary, and basic applications. Students engage in kinesthetic project-based learning experiences and writing. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology is an integral part of this course. 7th and 8th grade students only.

Pre-Requisites: A/B in Current Science Course with Teacher Recommendation *Requirements*: \$40.00 to cover supplies

Explorations

Office Aide—This one-year course is designed to allow students to train in the school office environment. Students selecting this course will be given an opportunity to gain on-the-job experiences in work routines, job responsibilities and positive attitudes in working with fellow students and school personnel. Students must have acceptable citizenship, good attendance, and academic achievement. This is a work experience course, and students will not be paid for their work. This is an elective course appropriate for grades seven through eight and may be repeated.

Requirements: Application and Administrative Approval

Peer Tutor—This one-year course is designed to allow students to assist teachers in classroom management. Under the direction of a supervising teacher, students will gain experience in clerical duties, laboratory assistance, working with faculty members, and following directions. This is an elective course for seventh and eighth grade students. This is an elective course appropriate for grades seven through eight and may be repeated.

Requirements: Application and Administrative Approval

Academic Fundamentals Electives

English Language Learner—This one-year course provides students with limited or no English proficiency the opportunity to develop listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in English. This course provides practice in correct usage of basic language structures both written and spoken. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The appropriate use of technology and digital media are integral parts of this course. This course fulfills the requirement for one middle school elective.

Pre-Requisites: Teacher Recommendation and Administrative Placement

Fundamentals of Math—This one-year intervention course in mathematics is designed for students who need additional instruction and support to master necessary middle school mathematics concepts. This course provides additional instruction in conjunction with the student's required mathematics course of study in grades 6, 7, and/or 8. Instructional practices incorporate integration of diversity awareness including appreciation of all cultures and their important contributions to society. The use of manipulatives, mathematical tools, and technology, including calculators and computer software, is an integral part of this course. This course is a repeatable elective course and does not fulfill the middle school mathematics requirement for promotion.

Pre-Requisites: Teacher Recommendation and Administrative Placement

Planning Ahead



The following outlines information regarding high school graduation and diploma requirements for high school. It is the goal of K. O. Knudson Middle School to prepare students for high school success and success in the 21st Century.

FOUR-YEAR ACADEMIC PLAN

Clark County School District Regulation 5127 states the following: Each ninth-grade student must have an approved four-year academic plan. The academic plan must set forth the specific educational goals that the student intends to achieve before graduation from high school. The plan may include, without limitation, the designation of a career pathway and enrollment in dual credit, career and technical education, Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Honors courses.

The ninth-grade student and his/her parent or legal guardian are required to work in consultation with a school counselor to develop an academic plan, sign the academic plan, review the academic plan at least once each school year in consultation with a school counselor, and revise the plan if necessary. For students enrolling in high school after ninth grade, an academic plan will be created with appropriate grade level modifications.

The academic plan must be used as a guide for the student and the parent or legal guardian to plan, monitor, and manage the student's educational development and make determinations of the appropriate course of study. If a student does not satisfy all of the goals set forth in the academic plan, he/ she is eligible to graduate and receive a high school diploma if requirements for a diploma are otherwise satisfied.

STANDARD DIPLOMA

To receive a standard high school diploma, each student must complete twenty-two and one-half (22.5) units of approved course work.

21st CENTURY COURSE OF STUDY CORE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

The Clark County School District strives to prepare graduates for success in post-secondary education and in the workforce by providing a rigorous curriculum. All high school students will be enrolled in the 21st Century Course of Study Core Curriculum (see table). Students will be scheduled into a fourth year of mathematics (which will include Algebra II or higher), and a third year of science. This is not a diploma. Students that do not successfully complete the 21st Century Course of Study Core Curriculum may still be eligible for a diploma.

The 21st Century Course of Study Core Curriculum provides the following for students:

- Opens doors to postsecondary education and workforce opportunities
- Meets Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) University Admissions Expectations
 - **3.00 GPA** (weighted or weighted with Bonus Points) *in the core* curriculum
 - Approved NSHE Core Curriculum (4 English, 3 Math, 3 Natural Science, 3 Social Science & History = 13 units)
- Prepares students for the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship
 - 3.25 cumulative GPA (weighted or weighted with Bonus Points) or 21 ACT composite score, or 990 combined SAT (taken prior to March 2016, or 1070 combined SAT (taken on or after March 2016) and the core curriculum (see table)
- Students may not take course work after graduation to meet Millennium Eligibility.

The 21st Century Course of Study Core Curriculum requirements are aligned with the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship minimum core curriculum requirements as outlined in both the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 396 and Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) Board of Regents Handbook Title 4 Chapter 18 Section 9. A student, including students accessing special education services, may be granted an enrollment exception to the 21st Century Course of Study Core Curriculum on a limited, individual basis. Please see a school counselor for details. Successful completion of this course of study will not impact a student's ability to earn a standard diploma.
